### **MOORESTOWN AND MEDFORD RESIDENTS NAMED TO CAMDEN CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL'S HALL OF FAME**

*Honored for achievement in athletics, successful careers*

CHERRY HILL, NJ – A football standout at Camden Catholic High School who went on to play for the NFL's Buffalo Bills, New England Patriots, Dallas Cowboys, Minnesota Vikings, and Arizona Cardinals who is now a Moorestown resident, and a starting quarterback who earned honors and acclaim for his prowess in high school, college, and the semi-pros who now resides in Medford are among the inductees to the 2008 Camden Catholic High School Hall of Fame.

William "Bill" Conaty Jr., Class of 1992, earned a place on the All-Olympic Conference, All-Parochial, and All-State teams as a center while in high school. With a scholarship to Virginia Tech University, he established a school record of 48 games played and started. During his college years, he played in the Independence Bowl, the Gator Bowl, the Sugar Bowl, and the Orange Bowl. He was *Sporting News* first Team All-American. His career with the NFL lasted nine years and earned him *USA Today*'s "All-Joe Team" award and an award from *Sports Illustrated* for his All-Pro season in 2001. Conaty is very active in charitable works and is now attending Rutgers University School of Law.

Ed Pyne, Class of 1962, played positions including center and defensive linebacker at Camden Catholic. During his football career, he earned First Team All-South Jersey, First Team All-Parochial, and later, Suburban Newspaper's All-Decade honors. In high school, he also played four seasons of

baseball and two seasons of basketball. He later played football at Temple University and then semi-pro in Pottstown, PA. He worked for 27 years for Levitz Furniture, retiring from the position of vice president and North East District Manager. He came out of retirement recently to open Angelo's Restaurant in the Bellevue Hotel in Philadelphia. He and his wife Patricia are the parents of three children and the grandparents of six.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Hall of Fame Induction takes place on April 19 at Camden Catholic High School in Cherry Hill.

Camden Catholic High School, Cherry Hill, NJ, a Catholic co-educational college preparatory school, was founded in 1887. Known for its academics, arts, and athletics, it has approximately 1,000 students from 70 towns and cities in South Jersey. Each year, approximately 95% of the students enroll in two- and four-year colleges.
